#### John Brockmueller - Chief of Police

New patrol car has been equipped and is complete. The car seems to be accepted by the community and
was in the parade for the Napavine Football Championship. The kids really liked the car and thanks to the
council for the vehicle. Mayor Pro Tem Duane Crouse asked the chief if DUI and Arrests are counted as
separate incidents on the stat report. Chief responded can be one of the same. Mayor Pro Tem also
commented that the car looks sharp!

#### Bryan Morris - PW/Community Development

• School Beacon going North is not working but is warrantied. Due to supply issues, it could take up to six months for replacement. The water line upgrade is moving forward, and two reducer stations will be replaced from 10 to 12 inch and a 60 HP pump will go in the storage room. The city will be at 3000 gallon per minute fire flow, which is very good. In the last meeting Bryan stated that he received the \$3M TIB Grant for Rush Road. He also just was approved for the \$280k pre-level conditioning for Rush Road. The two lanes will be replaced this summer. Mayor Pro Tem said the city looks fantastic with all the Christmas lights and trees on Stella. Bryan will be making changes next year to make better.

### BUDGET ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. 638

### AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2023

**WHEREAS,** the City of Napavine, Washington completed and placed on file with the City Clerk a proposed budget and estimate of the amount of moneys required to meet the public expenses, bond retirement and interest, reserve funds, and expenses of government of the City for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2023; and

**WHEREAS,** notice was published that the City Council would hold a public hearing on <u>December 27, 2022</u>, at 6:00 p.m., in the council chambers of city hall for the purposes of making and adopting a budget for said fiscal year and giving taxpayers within the limits of the City an opportunity to be heard in a public hearing upon said budget; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council did hold a public hearing at that time and place and did then consider the matter of the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2023 during a regular city council meeting at 6:00 p.m.; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council finds the proposed budget does not exceed the lawful limit of taxation allowed by law to be levied on the property within the City for the purposes set forth in the budget, and the estimated expenditures set forth in the budget being all necessary to carry on the government of the City for the fiscal year 2023 and being sufficient to meet the various needs of the City during that period;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the City Council of the City of Napavine, do ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1**. The budget for the City of Napavine, Washington for the year 2023 is hereby adopted at the fund level in its final form and content as set forth in the comprehensive budget document, "City of Napavine 2023 Budget", copies of which are on file in the Office of the City Clerk.

**SECTION 2.** Estimated resources, including fund balances for each separate fund of the City of Napavine, for the year 2023 are set forth in summary form below, and are hereby appropriated for expenditure at the fund level during the year 2023 as set forth in the City of Napavine 2023 Budget.

THIS DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT, dated as of December, 2022 is made by and between the City of Napavine, a municipal corporation (the "City"), and Clifford Morris and Laura Morris, husband and wife ("Morris" or "Developer").				

#### **RECITALS**

A. WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature has authorized the execution of a development agreement between a local government and a person having ownership or control of real property within its jurisdiction (RCW 36.70B.170(1)); and

- B. WHEREAS, a development agreement must set forth the development standards and other provisions that shall apply to and govern and vest the development, use, and mitigation of the development of the real property for the duration specified in the agreement (RCW 36.70B.170(1)); and
- C. WHEREAS, for the purposes of this development agreement, "Development Standards" includes, but is not limited to, all of the standards listed in RCW 36.70B.170(3); and
- D. WHEREAS, a development agreement must be consistent with the applicable development regulations adopted by a local government planning under chapter 36.70A RCW (RCW 36.70B.170(1)); and
- E. WHEREAS, Morris is the owner of property located at 609 Forest Napavine Rd. W., Napavine, Lewis County, Washington, all of which is located within the City limits (hereinafter referred to as the "Property") and legally described as follows:

Lots 1, 2, 3 & 4 of City of	Napavine Short Plat No	. 10-1422, recorded	under Lewis

- F. WHEREAS, this Development Agreement by and between the City of Napavine and the Developer (hereinafter the "Development Agreement"), relates to the development of the Property; and
- G. WHEREAS, Morris intends to develop the Property as residential property in accordance with the City's Development Standards and Regulations, applicable zoning, and application materials previously submitted and approved by the City (the "Development"); and
- H. WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 36.70B.170(4) a development agreement may obligate a party to fund or provide services or infrastructure or other facilities. A development agreement shall reserve authority to impose new or different regulations to the extent required by the serious threat to public health and safety; and
- I. WHEREAS, the parties agree that the Development would require a 2" water line for service to the existing and proposed residential lots; and

- J. WHEREAS, both parties agree upgrading the required 2" water line to an 8" water line would be beneficial for the City's water system as a whole; and
- K. WHEREAS, both parties agree that granting a utility easement to the City of Napavine as depicted on City of Napavine Short Plat No. 10-1422 (See Sheet 2 of 3, areas 7 and 8 identified as utility easement benefiting the City of Napavine), would be beneficial for the City's water system as a whole; and
- L. WHEREAS, the parties enter into this agreement under the authority of RCW 36.70B.170, Napavine Municipal Code Chapter 12.04, and the "Standard Specifications for Municipal Public Works Construction" (the "Standard Specifications"); and
- M. WHEREAS, after a public hearing on December 19, 2022, by Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_, the City Council authorized the Mayor to sign this Development Agreement with the Developer; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

#### **AGREEMENT**

- 1. **Incorporation of Recitals.** The parties hereby accept, ratify, and adopt the foregoing recitals into this Development Agreement and incorporate them herein by reference as material terms hereto.
- 2. Parties to Development Agreement. The parties to this Development Agreement are:
  - a. The "City" is the City of Napavine, 407 SW Birch Ave., Napavine, WA 98532
  - b. The "Developer" or Owner is Clifford Morris and Laura Morris, husband and wife.
  - c. The "Landowner." From time to time, as provided in this Development Agreement, the Developer may sell or otherwise lawfully dispose of all or a portion of the Property to a Landowner who, unless otherwise released, shall be subject to the applicable provisions of this Development Agreement related to such portion of the Property.
- 3. **Development is a Private Undertaking.** It is agreed among the parties that the Development is a private development, and that the City has no interest therein except as authorized in the exercise of its governmental functions.

- 4. **Term of Agreement.** This Development Agreement shall commence upon the effective date of the Adopting Ordinance approving this Development Agreement or upon the date of filing the short plat, whichever shall occur later, and shall continue in force for a period of five (5) years unless extended or terminated as provided herein. Following the expiration of the term or extension thereof, or if sooner terminated, this Development Agreement shall have no force and effect, subject however, to post-termination obligations of the Developer or Landowner.
- 5. **Developer Obligations.** Morris/Developer will install 680 lineal feet of 8" (eight inch) water pipe, approximately ten (10) fittings, and 60 cubic yards of sand, to be placed in a 20' utility easement as per City of Napavine Short Plat No. 10-1422; grant the City of Napavine the utility easements depicted on City of Napavine Short Plat No. 10-1422 (See Sheet 2 of 3, areas 7 and 8 identified as utility easement benefiting the City of Napavine); and install one (1) fire hydrant in the right-of-way as set forth in the engineered plans previously submitted and approved by the City. Furthermore, Developer shall build, construct, or develop the Property as set forth in the engineered plans submitted and approved by the City. Developer shall apply for any and all permits required by the City of Napavine prior to construction or development of the Property. Developer shall record this Development Agreement and the Short Plat upon receiving approval.
- 6. **City Obligations.** In exchange for the obligations of Developer contained in Section 5 of this Development Agreement, the City shall (a) waive three (3) sewer/water hookup fees on the Development; (b) waive permit fees for water line installation and one (1) fire hydrant to be placed in the right-of-way as set forth in the engineered plans previously submitted and approved by the City; (c) allow the private drive to remain as-is with a 20' utility easement as noted on City of Napavine Short Plat No. 10-1422; and (d) immediate and final approval of the City of Napavine Short Plat No. 10-1422 (as such Short Plat is currently configured), subject to filing/recording the Short Plat with the County Auditor pursuant to RCW 58.17.065.
- 7. Vested Rights of Developer. During the term of this Development Agreement, unless sooner terminated in accordance with the terms hereof, in developing the Property consistent with the Development described herein, Developer is assured, and the City agrees, that the development rights, obligations, terms, and conditions specified in this Development Agreement, are fully vested in the Developer and may not be changed or modified by the City, except as may be expressly permitted by, and in accordance with, the terms and conditions of this Development Agreement, including the Exhibits hereto,

or as expressly consented thereto by the Developer.

- 8. **Minor Modifications.** Minor modifications from the approved permits or the exhibits attached hereto may be approved in accordance with the provisions of the City's code, and shall not require an amendment to this Development Agreement.
- 9. Further Discretionary Actions. Developer acknowledges that the City's currently adopted and existing land use regulations contemplate the exercise of further discretionary powers by the City. These powers include, but are not limited to, review of additional permit applications under SEPA. Nothing in this Development Agreement shall be construed to limit the authority or the obligation of the City to hold legally required public hearings, or to limit the discretion of the City and any of its officers or officials in complying with or applying existing land use regulations.
- 10. **Existing Land Use Fees.** Land use fees adopted by the City by ordinance as of the Effective Date of this Development Agreement may be increased by the City from time to time, and applicable to permits and approvals for the Property, as long as such fees apply to similar applications and projects in the City.

#### 11. Default.

- a. Subject to extensions of time by mutual consent in writing, failure or delay by either party or Landowner not released from this Development Agreement, to perform any term or provision of this Development Agreement shall constitute a default. In the event of alleged default or breach of any terms or conditions of this Development Agreement, the party alleging such default or breach shall give the other party or Landowner not less than thirty (30) days' notice in writing, specifying the nature of the alleged default and the manner in which said default may be cured. During this thirty (30) day period, the party and Landowner charged shall not be considered in default for purposes of termination or institution of legal proceedings.
- b. After notice and expiration of the thirty (30) day period, if such default has not been cured or is not being diligently cured in the manner set forth in the notice, the other party or Landowner to this Development Agreement may, at its option, institute legal proceedings pursuant to this Development Agreement. In addition, the City may decide to file an action to enforce the City's Codes, and to obtain penalties and costs as provided in the Napavine Municipal Code for violations of this Development Agreement and the Code.

12. **Annual Review.** The City shall, at least every twelve (12) months during the term of this Development Agreement, review the extent of good faith substantial compliance by Developer and Landowner with this Development Agreement. The City may charge fees as necessary to cover the costs of conducting the annual review. Developer/Landowner shall be responsible for any fees associated with the conducting the annual review.

#### 13. Termination.

- a. This Development Agreement shall expire and/or terminate as provided below:
  - i. This Development Agreement shall expire and be of no further force and effect if the development contemplated in this Development Agreement and all of the permits and/or approvals issued by the City for such development are not substantially underway prior to expiration of such permits and/or approvals. Nothing in this Development Agreement shall extend the expiration date of any permit or approval issued by the City for any development.
  - ii. This Development Agreement shall expire or terminate and be of no further force and effect if the Developer does not construct the Development as contemplated by the permits and approvals identified in this Development Agreement.
- iii. This Development Agreement shall terminate upon the expiration of the term identified in Section 4 or when the Property has been fully developed, which ever first occurs. For purposes of this section, Fully Developed shall mean completion of all of the Developer's obligations in connection therewith as determined by the City.
- iv. This Development Agreement shall automatically terminate and be of no further force and effect as to any single-family residence, any other residential dwelling unit or any non-residential building and the lot or parcel upon which such residence or building is located, when it has been approved by the City for occupancy.
- b. Upon termination of this Development Agreement pursuant to subsections (a)(i) and (a)(ii), the City shall record a notice of such termination in a form satisfactory to the City Attorney that the Development Agreement has been terminated.
- 14. Effect upon Termination on Developer Obligations. Termination of this Development Agreement as to the Developer of the Property or any portion thereof shall not affect any of the Developer's obligations to comply with the City Comprehensive Plan and the terms and conditions or any applicable zoning code(s) or subdivision map or other land use entitlements approved with respect to the Property, any other conditions of any other development specified in the Development Agreement to continue after the termination

- of this Development Agreement or obligations to pay assessments, liens, fees or taxes. The obligation to install an 8" water line shall survive the termination of this Development Agreement.
- 15. Effects upon Termination on City. Upon any termination of this Development Agreement as to the Developer of the Property, or any portion thereof, the entitlements, conditions of development, limitations on fees and all other terms and conditions of this Development Agreement shall no longer be vested hereby with respect to the property affected by such termination (provided that vesting of such entitlements, conditions or fees may then be established for such property pursuant to then existing planning and zoning laws).
- 16. **Assignment and Assumption.** The Developer shall have the right to sell, assign or transfer this Development Agreement with all their rights, title and interests therein to any person, firm or corporation at any time during the term of this Development Agreement. Developer shall provide the City with written notice of any intent to sell, assign, or transfer all or a portion of the Property, at least 30 days in advance of such action.
- 17. Covenants Running with the Land. The conditions and covenants set forth in this Development Agreement and incorporated herein by the Exhibits shall run with the land and the benefits and burdens shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties. The Developer, Landowner and every purchaser, assignee or transferee of an interest in the Property, or any portion thereof, shall be obligated and bound by the terms and conditions of this Development Agreement, and shall be the beneficiary thereof and a party thereto, but only with respect to the Property, or such portion thereof, sold, assigned or transferred to it. Any such purchaser, assignee or transferee shall observe and fully perform all of the duties and obligations of a Developer contained in this Development Agreement, as such duties and obligations pertain to the portion of the Property sold, assigned or transferred to it.
- 18. Amendment to Agreement; Effect of Agreement on Future Actions. This Development Agreement may be amended by mutual consent of all of the parties, provided that any such amendment shall follow the process established by law for the adoption of a development agreement (see, RCW 36.70B.200). However, nothing in this Development Agreement shall prevent the City Council from making any amendment to its Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Code, Official Zoning Map or development regulations affecting the Property during the next five (5) years, as the City Council may deem

necessary to the extent required by a serious threat to public health and safety. Nothing in this Development Agreement shall prevent the City Council from making any amendments of any type to the Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Code, Official Zoning Map or development regulations relating to the Property five years from the anniversary date of the Effective Date of this Development Agreement.

- 19. **Releases.** Developer, Landowner, and any subsequent Landowner, may free itself from further obligations relating to the sold, assigned, or transferred property, provided that the buyer, assignee, or transferee expressly assumes the obligations under this Development Agreement as provided herein.
- 20. Notices. Notices, demands, correspondence to the City and Developer shall be sufficiently given if dispatched by pre-paid first-class mail to the addresses of the parties as designated in Section 2. Notice to the City shall be to the attention of both the City Clerk and the City Attorney. Notices to subsequent Landowners shall be required to be given by the City only for those Landowners who have given the City written notice of their address for such notice. The parties hereto may, from time to time, advise the other of new addresses for such notices, demands or correspondence.
- 21. Reimbursement for Agreement Expenses of the City. Developer agrees to reimburse the City for actual expenses incurred over and above fees paid by Developer as an applicant incurred by City directly relating to this Development Agreement, including recording fees, publishing fess and reasonable staff and consultant costs not otherwise included within application fees. This development agreement shall not take effect until the fees provided for in this section, as well as any processing fees owed to the City for the project are paid to the City. Upon payment of all expenses, the Developer may request written acknowledgement of all fees. Such payment of all fees shall be paid, at the latest, within thirty (30) days from the City's presentation of a written statement of charges to the Developer.
- 22. **Applicable Law and Attorneys' Fees.** This Development Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington. If litigation is initiated to enforce the terms of this Development Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and costs from the non-prevailing party. Venue for any action shall lie in Lewis County Superior Court.

- 23. Third Party Legal Challenge. In the event any legal action or special proceeding is commenced by any person or entity other than a party or a Landowner to challenge this Development Agreement or any provision herein, the City may elect to tender the defense of such lawsuit or individual claims in the lawsuit to Developer and/or Landowner(s). In such event, Developer and/or such Landowners shall hold the City harmless from and defend the City from all costs and expenses incurred in the defense of such lawsuit or individual claims in the lawsuit, including but not limited to, attorneys' fees and expenses of litigation, and damages awarded to the prevailing party or parties in such litigation. The Developer and/or Landowner shall not settle any lawsuit without the consent of the City. The City shall act in good faith and shall not unreasonably withhold consent to settle.
- 24. **General provisions.** In construing this Development Agreement, it is understood that if the context so requires the singular pronoun shall be taken to mean and include the plural, the masculine, the feminine, and the neuter, and that generally all grammatical changes shall be made, assumed, and implied to make the provisions hereof apply generally to one or more individuals and/or corporations, limited liability companies, and partnerships.
- 25. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, phrase, or provision of this Development Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, or if any provision of this Development Agreement is rendered invalid or unenforceable according to the terms of any statute of the State of Washington which became effective after the effective date of the ordinance adopting this Development Agreement, and either party in good faith determines that such provision or provisions are material to its entering into this Development Agreement, that party may elect to terminate this Development Agreement as to all of its obligations remaining unperformed.
- 26. **Reservation of City Authority.** As required by RCW 36.70B.170(4) and notwithstanding any other term of this Development Agreement, the City reserves the right to establish and impose new or different additional regulations to the extent required to address a serious threat to public health and safety.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT WITH CLIFFORD MORRIS AND LAURA MORRIS, GOVERNING DEVELOPMENT OF A PARCEL IN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

#### **RECITALS:**

WHEREAS, the City of Napavine, Washington (the "City") is a Code City under the laws of the State of Washington; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 35A.11.020, the City may adopt and enforce ordinances of all kinds relating to and regulating the City's local or municipal affairs and appropriate to the good

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to enter into and execute a development agreement with a person having ownership or control of real property within its jurisdiction (RCW 36.70B.170(1)); and

WHEREAS, Morris is the owner of property located at 609 Forest Napavine Rd. W., Napavine, Lewis County, Washington, all of which is located within the City limits (hereinafter referred to as the "Property") and described as follows:

WHEREAS, this Development Agreement by and between the City of Napavine and the Developer (hereinafter the "Development Agreement"), relates to the development of the Property; and

WHEREAS, Morris intends to develop the subject Property as residential property in accordance with the City's Development Regulations and applicable zoning (the "Development").

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 36.70B.170(4) a Development Agreement may obligate a party to fund or provide services of infrastructure or other facilities. A Development Agreement shall

reserve authority to impose new or different regulations to the extent required by the serious threat to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the parties agree that the Development would require a 2" water line for service to the existing and proposed residential lots; and

WHEREAS, both parties agree that upgrading the 2" water line to an 8" water line, would be beneficial for the water system as a whole; and

WHEREAS, both parties agree that granting a utility easement to the City of Napavine as depicted on City of Napavine Short Plat No. 10-1422 (See Sheet 2 of 3, areas 7 and 8 identified as utility easement benefiting the City of Napavine), would be beneficial for the water system as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to enter into a development agreement with Morris as set forth herein.

### NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Development Agreement.</u> The City Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to execute a Development Agreement with Clifford Morris and Laura Morris, husband and wife, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 36.70B RCW to govern development of a parcel of real property located in the city limits of the City of Napavine, a copy of which Development Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof by this reference.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance should be held to be unconstitutional or unlawful by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect five (5) days after its publication, or publication of a summary therefore, in the City's official newspaper, or as otherwise provided by law.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Corrections.</u> The City Clerk and the codifiers of this ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbers, section/subsection numbers, and any references thereto.

#### ORDINANCE NO. <u>644</u>

AN ORDINANCE OF THE NAPAVINE CITY COUNCIL, AMENDING SECTION 2.24.065 MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE NAPAVINE MUNICIPAL CODE, CHANGING MUNICIPAL COURT OFFICE HOURS, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND SEVERABILITY HEREOF.

**WHEREAS,** the City of Napavine, Washington (the "City") is a Code City under the laws of the State of Washington; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to RCW 35A.11.020, the City Council has the power to adopt and enforce ordinances of all kinds relating to and regulating the City's municipal affairs and has all powers possible for a city or town to have under the Constitution of this state, not specifically denied to code cities by law; and

WHEREAS, all references herein to "NMC" means the "Napavine Municipal Code;" and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to RCW 35A.21.070, the City Council has the power to prescribe such days and hours that City offices shall be kept open for the transaction of business; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to RCW 3.50.110, the City Council has the power to prescribe when the Court shall be open and when the Court shall be in session; and

**WHEREAS,** the Napavine Municipal Code and the City's current Agreement for Municipal Court Judge Services is silent regarding hours of operation of the Court; and

**WHEREAS,** the City desires to amend Section 2.24.065 to Chapter 2.24 of the NMC, Municipal Court Office Hours.

NOW, THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 2.24 of the Napavine Municipal Code, as last amended by Ordinance NO. 619, is hereby amending section 2.24.065 entitled "Municipal Court Office Hours" as follows:

#### 2.24.065 Municipal Court Office Hours

- (1) The Office of the Municipal Court shall be kept open for the transaction of business, except in the event of legal holiday or budget/staffing constraints, as follows:
  - (a) 8:30 am to 3:00 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday.
  - (b) 8:30 am to 4:30 pm on Thursday.

#### a) 8:00 am to 4:30 pm Monday-Friday

(2) The Office of the Municipal Court shall be closed for half (1/2) hour each day of operation from 12:00 pm to 12:30 pm.

#### **SECTION 2. Severability Clause**

If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or void, such invalidity shall not thereby affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

#### **SECTION 3.** Effective date.

The effective date of this ordinance shall be five (5) days after its passage, approval, and publication.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 22-12-137**

### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON, FINALIZING THE UPDATE OF THE CAPITAL FACILITIES PLAN FOR THE CITY OF NAPAVINE.

**WHEREAS,** the Washington State Legislature passed, and the Governor signed into law, the Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) of 1990 and amendments thereto (hereinafter the Act), requiring selected counties and cities to prepare comprehensive plans consistent with the provisions of the Act, all as generally codified at Chapter 36.70A RCW; and

**WHEREAS,** the Act requires municipalities to establish within their comprehensive plans, a Capital Facilities Element, including level of service standards and a six-year minimum financing plan to identify anticipated revenue sources and capital projects, including their anticipated costs, required to meet the established level of service standards; and

**WHEREAS,** the Capital Facilities Element is contained in the Napavine Comprehensive Plan (hereinafter the Comp Plan), and the Napavine Municipal Code states the City Council can reserve the authority to consider and act upon any suggested amendment without referring the suggested amendment to the applicable advisory body for recommendation; and

**WHEREAS**, to be incompliance with the Act and the City's annual budget process, the Capital Facilities Plan needs to incorporate a six-year planning period; and;

**WHEREAS**, the first year of the Capital Facilities Plan period is designed to be incorporated in the City's budget; and;

**WHEREAS,** in previous years the Planning Commission held a public hearing to obtain public input on the Capital Facilities Element and provided a recommendation to the City Council; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council of the City of Napavine is desirous of amending the established process of having the Planning Commission review the Capital Facilities Element annually to be consistent with the City's annual budget process; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council has acknowledged through the roadmap setting the process that establishment of the Capital Facilities Plan in an essential element to the future financial planning process for the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** <u>Capital Facilities Plan Adopted</u>. The Napavine Capital Facilities Plan attached hereto and incorporated by reference is hereby adopted. The Plan shall be known as the "2023-2028 Napavine Capital Facilities Plan" and is the City's generalized coordinated capital facilities document adopted pursuant to RCW 35A.63.072.
- **Section 2.** All capital improvement projects to be included in the CFP must fall within the following project categories with a minimum project cost of \$25,000; and capital equipment with a minimum equipment cost of \$5,000

- 1) Permanent improvement of land and/or infrastructure such as:
  - a. Street Construction, transportation improvement, etc.
  - b. Sidewalk/walkway construction
  - c. Public facilities
  - d. Sewer facilities
  - e. Water facilities
  - f. Office/building remodel
  - g. Recreational facilities
- 2) Land acquisition
- 3) Special projects such as large-scale landscaping projects, neighborhood improvements and other special projects.
- 4) Capital Equipment
- **Section 3.** All capital facilities projects included in the six-year Capital Facilities Plan shall be funded with revenue anticipated in the year the project is programmed. The first year of the six-year Capital Facilities Plan shall be incorporated into the City's annual budget. The following City funds may be used for capital facilities projects:
  - A. General Fund
  - B. Park Improvement Fund
  - C. Capital Equipment Improvement Fund
  - D. City Street Fund
  - E. Street Equipment Fund
  - F. Street Improvement Fund
  - G. Water System Improvement Fund
  - H. Water Equipment Fund
  - I. Wastewater System Improvement Fund
  - J. Sewer Equipment Fund
  - K. Any new funds established by City Council for specific projects
  - L. Federal, state and local grants
  - M. Other funding sources such as contributions from private sources
- **Section 4.** The City Council may at any time during a calendar year find it necessary to revise the priorities and projects in the adopted CFP based upon special circumstances. In the event the Council deems it necessary to make a change, they may request the department heads for its evaluation and recommendation.
- **Section 5.** The City Clerk is authorized to make necessary corrections to this resolution including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, resolution numbering, section/subsection numbers any references thereto.

- ◆ <u>PARS</u>: Rachelle will be preparing PARs for all staff due to the pay increases that will be effective January 1, 2023 and due to the rounding of time to the nearest .25 for the payroll time keeping system that is used now.
- ◆ <u>Department Head Meetings:</u> Beginning January the department head meetings will change from the third Tuesday of each month to the third Wednesday at 9 am.
- ♦ Municipal Court: The police department is now doing court security and will be available at 12:30 pm for court security check-in. Effective January 1, 2023, the court hours will be open from 8:00am-4:30pm.
- ◆ <u>Court room Carpet Installation:</u> The court room will be getting new carpet early February along with the judge stand being lowered end of January.
- ◆ Ordinances: Rachelle is working on amending a few ordinances due to the city hiring a hearing examiner for projects.
- ◆ Fee Schedule: We discussed the fee schedule and pass-through fees. Will look more into fees in 2023.
- ◆ Reserve Program-Police Department: The chief discussed the reserve program and that his intention is to keep it small. The current reserve officer has to do a minimum of 16 hrs. of volunteer time. The chief is going to talk with the mayor about the possibility of paying the reserve for approved time only. This is due to the department being down a full-time officer and would allow for better coverage.

### CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON ORDINANCE NO. 628-C

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, LEWIS COUNTY, WASHINGTON AMENDING THE 2022 BUDGET; AND PROVIDING FOR THE CITY TREASURER TO IMPLEMENT THESE CHANGES.

**WHEREAS,** the City of Napavine adopted the 2022 Budget in final form by Ordinance No. <u>628</u> on the <u>14<sup>th</sup></u> day of <u>December</u> 2021 and 2022 Budget Amendment Ordinance No 628-A, and 2022 Budget Amendment Ordinance No 628-B; and

**WHEREAS,** subsequent thereto it has become necessary for the City to amend said ordinance because expenditures which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of adopting said budget; and

**WHEREAS,** subsequent thereto it has become necessary for the City to amend said ordinance because of expenditures of same; and

WHEREAS, sufficient funds are available; and

**WHEREAS**, the City is desirous of amending its budget.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPAVINE, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** The following funds contained in the 2022 Budget are hereby amended as set forth below:

**Section 2.** The budget for the year 2022 is amended to provide for the changes outlined above, and a complete copy of the amended budget of the city is filed in the office of the City Treasurer.

**Section 3.** The Annual Budget of the City of Napavine, Washington, for the calendar year 2022 shall be, and the same hereby is, amended as to: (See Exhibit A for detail attached)

- Increase appropriations to the Criminal Justice Fund in the amount of Ten Thousand dollars (\$10,000)
- **Section 5.** The City Treasurer of the city of Napavine, Washington, shall be, and is hereby authorized and directed to affect the budget amendments herein provided.
- **Section 6. Repeal**, All ordinances, resolutions, laws and regulations, or parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance are, to the extent of said conflict, hereby repealed.
- **Section 7. Severability**, If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.
- **Section 8. Corrections.** The City Clerk and the codifiers of this ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbers, section/subsection numbers, and any references thereto.
- **Section 9. Effective Date:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from five (5) days after its publication or a publication of a summary of this ordinance in the official newspaper of the City.
